# Heroes' contributions to TSU

Teroes are the pillars of our nation's democracy. They sacrificed for the sake of freedom. In the case of Tarlac A State University, the heroes lauded for democracy are also the same ones who valued education. Freedom from ignorance is another major change they wanted to see in Tarlac.

This November, two heroes were commemorated due to their immense contributions in the Tarlac Province, particularly in the birth and development of TSU.

The university celebrated the 150th birth anniversary of Gen. Emilio Aguinaldo last November 8, 2019 by holding a National Forum on Tarlac as the Last Capital of the Aguinaldo Republic.

Another hero's birth anniversary is celebrated in Tarlac every November 27th. Benigno "Ninoy" S. Aquino, Jr. is commemorated in the province as a Tarlaqueño with various contributions in the country by virtue of Republic Act No. 8151, also known as Ninoy Aquino Day.

Historical reminders were shared during the commemoration of the birth of the two heroes - wherein both are intertwined in the start and further growth of education in the province.

The Cientifico-Literaria Universidad de Filipinas en Tarlac was the forerunner of TSU. When Aguinaldo transferred the seat of power of the Philippine Revolutionary Government from Malolos, Bulacan to Tarlac Province, the Universidad came along bringing higher education the province. Aguinaldo literacy brough him establishment

University in Tarlac.

Aguinaldo is recognized in TSU as its first honorary university president, referring to the Universidad. It is a fact, as shared by historian Michael Charleston B. Chua, that the actual site of the Universidad is not in the present TSU grounds - the original building was located beside the now San Sebastian Cathedral. However, the historical essence still lingers in TSU evidenced by the marker placed by the National

Historical Commission at the old building of the College of Computer Studies where the Casa Real de Tarlac once stood.

University of Tarlac, the first provincial state university. Dr. Lino L. Dizon posted on Facebook during the Ninoy Aquino Day that Aquino was determined to make education his main plank, which was written by Nick Joaquin.

Six years after Aquino's assassination, TCT was converted to TSU - fulfilling the vision of the late Tarlac governor and further strengthening tertiary education in the province.

113 year later, TSU is standing tall as one premier university in the province offering quality and relevant education. Its place in the higher echelon of tertiary education among state universities and colleges in the Philippines was once a dream, a sacrifice, a vision, shared by two heroes of different generations.

### TSU grad ranks 10th in the RPM board exams; Psych Department improves board performance



In 2010, Maria Mei Fatima Simbol-Terania was supposed to graduate from college with a bachelor's degree in Civil Engineering at the Technological Institute of the Philippines (TIP). Instead, she graduated in 2019 with a degree in Psychology at Tarlac State University and eventually placing 10th in the October 2019 Psychometrician Licensure Examination with a score of 84.60% from the results posted by the Professional Regulation Commission (PRC).

Born from a carpenter father and a housewife, Terania managed to become an outstanding student even in high school. She was the Editor-In-Chief of their school paper, a representative in journalism and science competitions, and was even awarded as Cadet of the Year. She even took up a Basic Computer Course in Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA).

With her family's insistence, she took up Civil Engineering in TIP. However due to tuition fee increase, she had to stop and find work in an architectural and engineering firm for two years as a steel detailer. Here, she met her now-husband and they had two daughters. When her daughters were old enough, her husband urged her to go back and continue her studies making her take AB Psychology as it was her favored choice since then.

Terania enrolled in TSU taking up AB Psychology in 2014 at the age of 27. However, she had to rest for a year for carrying and giving birth to her third daughter. Nevertheless, she graduated with high marks while serving in various organizations such as being the Development Communication Editor of The Oracle, the official student publication of the College of Arts and Social Sciences, a member of TSU-Philippine Science Consortium, and a member of COESSE-The Psychological Society.

"Isa siya dun sa mga masisipag na estudyante. Dahil naging OJT ko din siya, pagdating sa mga trabaho, talagang masinop siya - conscientious. At the same time, gano'n din siya sa pagre-review. Despite na meron siyang mga anak, tina-try niya pa ring makapag review at makapagbasa," said Mr. Jersey Pangilinan, Chairperson of the Psychology Department, in an interview.

When asked about her exams, she mentioned that she didn't expect to be included in the top 10. She also felt a bit guilty because she's never been good at reading books. Thus, she relied on her notes and listened extensively during discussions. Therefore, she's extra thankful for the TSU Psychology Department.

"Lahat ng alam ko nanggaling dito eh [from TSU]. Kasi, hindi nga ako nakakapag-review talaga ng sarili ko. Kaya lahat ng tinuro, yun lang din yung alam ko. Ibig sabihin kaya na nating makipag-compete sa other schools when it comes to the department's curriculum," she added.

Meanwhile, TSU significantly improved with an overall passing rate of 72% and 76.79% for its first-time takers against the 63.73% national passing rate.

Since the board examinations for Psychologists and Psychometricians just started in 2014, the department struggled to surpass the national passing rate. There was a need to adjust as to what the expectations during examinations. Also, the number of previous batches are more than the number of the current graduates who are both taking the board exam which is a challenge, according to Pangilinan.

However, the department continues to improve by setting a higher retention policy from 2.50 to 2.0 as well as training their students in answering and analyzing tests starting from their second year until they reach their fourth year standing.

"Ang fino-forecast namin ngayon is iyong for batch 2022, kasi sila yung mga 2nd year ngayon. Ito yung mga mas tinuturuan na kung paano mag-take ng exams, kung paano mag-analyze. We are following the trend, kung ano ba 'yung dapat basahin kasi maraming books- 'yung mga kadalasang books na ginagamit sa board exam na iyong ginagamit namin," he added.

Around 100 leaders, specialist educators, and staff developers from Institutions for Higher Learning in Asia attended the event.

In an interview, President Mallari shared that the CDIO is a methodological concept that focuses on technology.

"It is an approach, meaning, you lessen lecture. It's about enabling them [students] to think for themselves – something that they can produce. Based on your discussion, they [will] be able to conceive something, develop it, and then make it run," President Mallari said.

The CDIO™ INITIATIVE is an innovative educational framework for producing the next generation of engineers. The framework provides students with an education that stresses engineering fundamentals set in the context of Conceiving — Designing — Implementing — Operating (CDIO) real-world systems and products. The CDIO network therefore welcomes members in a diverse range of institutions ranging from research-led internationally acclaimed universities to local colleges dedicated to providing students with their initial grounding in engineering.

"As a result of that, we are inviting Andrew Tan to come here [TSU] and discuss a partnership. CDIO is a foundation, and they are financing activities that will develop CDIO concepts. He will also lecture the CDIO concept among our faculty," Dr. Mallari added.

Andrew Tan is currently the Deputy General Manager





of SP International that engages the industry actively through collaborations in Singapore and overseas.

The Philippine Association of State Universities and Colleges (PASUC) launched the Platform for Innovating SUCs for Industry 4.0 (PISI) in partnership with the USAID-Science, Technology, Research and Innovation for Development (STRIDE) Program, Philippine Development Foundation (PhilDev), and Singapore Polytechnic (SP) last February 12. 2019.

Meanwhile, the TSU Alumni Organization – Singapore Chapter, headed by Engr. Jerone C. Jimenez, grabbed the opportunity for a short get together with Dr. Mallari during her short stay in the country.

The SG Chapter, composed of TSU graduates residing and working in Singapore, was formally established on March 3, 2018 at Maysprings, Singapore.

## Dr. Niño Corpuz wins 1st best paper in the National **Gender & Development Research Congress**

Tarlac State University's Dr. Niño B. Corpuz won the 1st Best Paper award during the National Gender and Development Research Congress hosted by Central Luzon State University (CLSU) on November 13 to 15, 2019 at the Research, Extension, and Training (RET) Amphitheater, Science City of Muñoz, Nueva Ecija.

His paper entitled "Exploring the Experiences of Men as Early Childhood Educators" analyzes the experiences of ten male public kindergarten teachers from the Province of Tarlac that focuses on four areas: classroom management, teaching strategies, colleagues' relationship, parental involvement. It is a qualitative research that recognizes the involvement of male teachers in the field of Early Childhood Education (ECE) as well as

showcasing their struggles from male stereotype on

nurturing behavior.

"I got interested kasi understudied ang mga male teachers, that's the rationale behind my study. Hindi kasi recognized ang male teachers sa early childhood, sa pre-school dahil sa stigma. Parang ikaw, kung may anak kang pre-schooler, kanino mo ieentrust sa babae or lalaking teacher? I would like to challenge the idea na merong ginagawang maganda ang mga male teachers. I highlighted their best practices, that these male teachers are also nurturers," Dr. Corpuz said in an interview.

He wishes that his research will be a challenge to educational institutions and concerned government agencies like the Department of Education to

> further increase male enrollees in the ECE program.

"My study would not stop the stigma, but I believe my study would contribute [to] the existing literature that there are male teachers who are doing their best in nurturing young children," he added.

His paper prevailed in the Professional Category: Gender in Education, Database, and ICT Studies among seven (7) other including researchers/groups TSU's Dr. Daisy T. Inalvez, Dr. Jessica Dela Peña, and Ms. Juvy V. Galamay's research entitled "Integrasyon ng Edukasyong Gender sa Pagtuturo ng Filipino".

The National Gender and Development Research Congress is a collaboration of CLSU's Gender and Development Office, Central Luzon Agriculture, Aquatic and Resources Research and Development Consortium (CLAARRDEC) and Research Office which aims to showcase research papers focusing on gender issues, gender inclusion, gender mainstreaming strategies, and gender concerns in agriculture, social and education settings, communication, and economic sector.

Their apparatus can also print the

results and findings.

"Sa apparatus po namin nandoon na lahat pati computation and interpolation. Tapos pwede rin po i-print ang results. Basically, for field of civil engineering po talaga 'yung study lalo na ang foundation ang mahalaga sa structure," Manzano further said.

During the awarding ceremony, the students were accompanied by their thesis adviser, Engr. Yoshio Otsuka. They received certificates and 20,000 pesos cash prize.
